

RADIATION SAFETY ACT Amendment to Registration: Transfer or Final Disposal of Irradiating Apparatus and/or Electronic Products

This form must be completed and signed by the sale or disposal agent **and** either the registrant or radiation safety officer as appropriate for each party involved.

Amendment to Registration – Irradiating Apparatus and/or Electronic Products

The Radiation Safety Act 1975 requires anyone who sells or acquires radiation producing equipment to notify the Radiological Council. It is an offence to sell or dispose of radiation producing equipment unless the person to whom it is being transferred holds a licence or exemption granted under the Act.

This form should only be completed for irradiating apparatus or electronic products. A separate form is available for radioactive substances.

 The form must be signed by both parties. A licence number is not applicable to dentists. Fill in all required details and send the form to the Secretary of the Radiological Council –

2. Equipment:

Serial Number For x-ray units, record the generator serial number.

Output	For x-ray units, record the maximum kVp and mA.
	For radiotherapy equipment, record the types of beams and energies.
	For lasers and transilluminators, record the mW and wavelength.

Equipment e.g. CT; intraoral, OPG; fixed/mobile radiographic; fixed/mobile/c-arm fluoroscopic; therapy; research; linac; superficial radiotherapy; laser; industrial radiography; transilluminator; XRD; XRF; cabinet x-ray.

3. Disposal:

Final disposal of any irradiating apparatus or electronic product must be carried out by a qualified person in accordance with the methods below:

X-ray equipment	Either burn out the filament or eliminate the vacuum inside the
	x-ray tube (break the glass envelope).

Lasers Sever the power supply cord and remove the critical optical components and the amplifying medium.

Sun-tanning units, Sever the power supply cord and destroy (break) the UV lights. *transilluminators*

This will satisfy the Radiation Safety Act only, other relevant state and local government requirements must also be considered. In all cases, the person disposing of the equipment must take into account the presence of other hazardous materials.

4. New Installations:

Prior to equipment being registered for use in a new location, a plan of the premises must be submitted to the Radiological Council for assessment. Information on the requirements for each type of equipment can be obtained from the Radiological Council.

In addition, medical x-ray equipment must not be used for human radiography unless it has a current certificate of compliance, certificate of conditional compliance, certificate of provisional compliance, notice of non-compliance or an exemption from compliance granted by the Radiological Council.
